EU AI Act in Practice: High-Risk Classification Workshop (Art. 6 + Annex III)

In 2026, the EU AI Act is no longer an abstract document on a Chief Compliance Officer's desk. It is becoming a concrete set of expectations and requirements that will shape how organizations design, deploy, and govern AI systems in day-to-day operations. For high-risk systems, compliance obligations begin before market placement and misclassification is the most expensive error.

In practice, the compliance effort is driven largely by a system's intended purpose and your role in the value chain (e.g., provider or deployer) - all starting with getting the risk classification right.

This workshop focuses on one thing - classification. We'll translate Article 6 and Annex III into a practical workflow you can apply to your organization's AI portfolio. The second half is interactive: we will classify several use cases, document the rationale and compare outcomes to improve consistency and auditability.

Key outcomes

- Build a practical decision flow to classify AI use cases under the EU AI Act
- Understand the two routes to "high-risk" (Article 6) and escape clauses
- Document a clear classification rationale that can be reused in internal governance processes
